
# The current frame

"...online opportunities and risks go hand in hand: the more children and young people experience the one, the more they also experience the other, and vice-versa."



# Risk and opportunity based policy & practice

# Blocking & restriction-focussed responses are frequently counter-productive

Allowing adults to ignore responsibilities; denying participation of young people in online spaces; circumvention increases risk.

## Ineffective safety messages

Restriction-focused responses undermine other rights Rights to participation, provision, privacy and other protections.

Confusing risk to organisations and risk to young people


Services neglecting digital dimensions of young people's lives Missing support needs; and opportunities to develop opportunities.

Narrow youth fora pre-empt conclusions.



# Rooted in comprehensive and substantive rights

# **Protection**

#### **Article 19**


States Parties shall take all appropriate legislative, administrative, social and educational measures to protect the child from all forms of physical or mental violence, injury or abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment or exploitation, including sexual abuse, while in the care of parent(s), legal guardian(s) or any other person who has the care of the child.

#### **Article 16**

No child shall be subjected to arbitrary or unlawful interference with his or her privacy, family, or correspondence, nor to unlawful attacks on his or her honour and reputation.

#### **Article 32**

States Parties recognize the right of the child to be protected from economic exploitation and from performing any work that is likely to be hazardous or to interfere with the child's education, or to be harmful to the child's health or physical, mental, spiritual, moral or social development.



# **Provision**

#### Article 28 and 29


States Parties recognize the right of the child to education; [T]he education of the child shall be directed to: (a) The development of the child's personality... (b) The development of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms,...(d) The preparation of the child for responsible life in a free society, in the spirit of understanding, peace, tolerance, equality of sexes, and friendship among all peoples, ethnic, national and religious groups and persons of indigenous origin;

#### Article 31

States Parties recognize the right of the child to rest and leisure, to engage in play and recreational activities appropriate to the age of the child and to participate freely in cultural life and the arts.

#### **Article 17**

States Parties recognize the important function performed by the mass media and shall ensure that the child has access to information and material from a diversity of national and international sources, especially those aimed at the promotion of his or her...well-being and physical and mental health.



# **Participation**

#### **Article 12**

States Parties shall assure to the child who is capable of forming his or her own views the right to express those views freely in all matters affecting the child, the views of the child being given due weight in accordance with the age and maturity of the child.

#### **Article 13**

The child shall have the right to freedom of expression; this right shall include freedom to seek, receive and impart information and ideas of all kinds, regardless of frontiers, either orally, in writing or in print, in the form of art, or through any other media of the child's choice.

#### **Article 15**

States Parties recognize the rights of the child to freedom of association and to freedom of peaceful assembly.

# Summary

- The opportunity-risk discourse is no longer helpful as a framework for research, policy or practice;
- A 3P model based on the UNCRC offers a framework for taking a broader view on issues of digital literacy and young people's online lives, identifying interlocking responsibilities of different stakeholders;
